

THINGS TO DO IN THE TOMAH/WARRENS AREA

Warrens and Tomah are about 17 minutes apart by car.

Lodging

If you want to break up your drive, there is lodging nearby in Warrens at Three Bears Lodge starting at \$60.00 a night. See http://www.threebearsresort.com/. There's also other lodging nearby.

Activities

September is cranberry harvest time. In fact, the Cranberry Festival is the following weekend (September 23 - 25). But we should be able to find cranberries the week before.

Visit the Cranberry Discovery Center in Warrens. To tour the museum costs \$5.00 or less (seniors get a break). It includes a visit to the Taste Test Kitchen & Ice Cream Parlor. Pick Some Apples. September is apple season too. There are likely many places nearby as well as on your route home. There is a pick your own place in Warrens. Rex Moseley Fruit and Vegetable Farm – apples 23933 Cortland Avenue, Warrens, WI. Phone: 608-378-4543. Open: 7 days a week. 9 to 5 pm starting in mid September thru the middle of November. Pick your own and already picked apples. Varieties include, Paula Red, McIntosh, Cortland, Spartan, Honey Crisp, Regent, Golden Delicious, Red Delicious, Empire, and Fireside.
